New Orthopedic Facility Approved for Johnson Creek

We've highlighted Johnson Creek's growing appeal to developers of all types, and the Village continues to see exciting new investment. With the recent approval on May 12th, a significant new development is set to bring both high-quality medical services and a variety of jobs to the area.

John L Swisher Village President Orthopaedic Associates of Wisconsin (OAW) has submitted plans for a 46,000-square-foot clinic and outpatient surgery center at the intersection of Hartwig Boulevard and North Watertown Street.

Known for their dedication to delivering specialized musculoskeletal care, OAW serves patients throughout the region with expertise in hand and upper extremity, spine, arthroplasty, total joint reconstruction, sports medicine, foot, and ankle surgeries.

Staffing at the facility will vary by day, but the center is expected to employ more than 75 professionals throughout the week. This new addition not only strengthens Johnson Creek's healthcare infrastructure but also enhances access to specialized care for the broader region.

"This project brings valuable services and quality jobs to Johnson Creek," said Village President John Swisher. "It's a strong step forward for our community."

CLERK'S CORNER

SEWER UTILITY RATE CHANGE

Last year, the first phase of a two-step sewer utility rate increase was implemented. The second phase, an 8% increase, will be implemented with the billing in early August. These changes were necessary to address a deficiency in the current rates covering operation and maintenance costs as well as financing construction of a sludge dewatering facility. The facility will replace equipment that is no longer functioning which has caused the sewer utility to incur nearly \$200,000 in annual costs to transport waste for processing. The project is slated to begin soon with demolition and site preparation in 2025 and construction of the facility slated for 2026.

LAWN AND WEED CONTROL

With warm weather and sunshine, grass is beginning to grow. Johnson Creek Ordinance 108-2 requires owners of property in the Village to mow grasses or weeds exceeding eight (8) inches in height on both occupied and vacant lots. If the Public Works Department must step in to bring a property into compliance, the fee charged to the property owner is \$150.00 per hour (one-hour minimum) each time the property is maintained. Do not mow or blow grass clippings into the street.

REMARKS FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

April saw a significant increase in call volume from March with a total of 60 emergency responses. Our members trained in rope rescue techniques and the removal of firefighters and civilians from different types of environments. The utilization of ropes, webbing and other specialty tools is a fundamental skill that all firefighters must be proficient in. These types of incidents are rare but when they unfortunately do occur, training sets in and we use every tool in our arsenal.

Chief Patterson attended the Fire Department Instructors Conference, better known as FDIC, and met with numerous vendors and agencies to gather information on the ever-changing industry standards. This is the largest conference of its kind in the world and hosts thousands of firefighters from all over the world. It is one of the best places in the country to gather information on training, apparatus, health and safety, leadership and many other topics.

Department and Village leadership also met with Township leadership this month to review service delivery, customer service, response models and numerous other topics. This meeting went very well, and we are proud to continue to serve our surrounding Townships. We continue to look to the future and how we can continue to provide the best possible service to all.
